





TEAMSTERS APPLAUD SOMERVILLE CITY COUNCIL VOTE TO STOP MISCLASSIFICATION OF WORKERS

(SOMERVILLE, MA) — Teamsters Local 25 praised the Somerville City Council today for its unanimous vote to pass a resolution aimed at stopping Uber, Lyft, Doordash and other so-called 'gig' companies from abusing drivers by misclassifying them as independent contractors.

The full City Council voted in favor of a resolution calling on the Massachusetts Legislature to pass the Act, "Establishing Protections and Accountability for Transportation Network Company (TNC) and Delivery Network Company (DNC) Workers." The resolution was co-sponsored by City Council President Ben Ewen-Campen of Ward 3 and Ward 4 Councilor Jesse Clingan and was passed by a vote of 11-0.

The Teamsters previously endorsed legislation (S.627/H.1158) authored by State Senator Lydia Edwards (D-Third Suffolk) and State Representative Andy Vargas (D-Third Essex) that would protect union members from having their compensation and benefits undercut by bad employers by extending collective bargaining rights to workers at app-based companies while simultaneously strengthening state and federal statutes that protect employees from being misclassified as independent contractors.

"Thank you to the Somerville City Council for standing up and fighting back against the abuse of the workers and taxpayers of Massachusetts," said Tom Mari, President of Teamsters Local 25. "Big Tech and billion-dollar companies like Uber and Lyft are denying their workforce fair wages, benefits, and job protections and externalizing their labor costs onto the public while reaping enormous profits. They must be held accountable like every other company."

In its resolution, the Somerville City Council makes clear that TNC and DNC companies are currently misclassifying drivers as independent contractors and pointed to the lawsuit filed against these companies by the Massachusetts Attorney General for wage theft and misclassification because the drivers are employees. The resolution also notes that Uber, Lyft, Doordash and others are using misclassification to avoid contributing to social programs such as unemployment workers' compensation and the paid family medical leave funded

by all other employers. It also highlighted a recent financial assessment of TNCs which found that during a period of ten years, hundreds of millions of dollars were owed to Massachusetts benefit programs. In 2023 alone, Uber and Lyft earned \$1.4 Billion but contributed nothing to Massachusetts benefit programs, owing the Commonwealth \$47 Million.

SOMERVILLE HS STUDENTS VISIT CHA CAMBRIDGE HOSPITAL OPERATING ROOM TO LEARN ABOUT SURGICAL CAREERS

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. — Cambridge Health Alliance, a community health system serving Cambridge, Somerville, and Boston's metro-north communities, recently hosted an exciting event for local students interested in healthcare careers. As part of CHA's Career Pathways Program, high school students from Somerville participated in a special Saturday Program at CHA Cambridge Hospital.

On Saturday, April 27, the students visited the CHA Cambridge Hospital Operating Room to learn more about CHA's Robotic and Minimally Invasive Surgery programs. This included hands-on experience in a simulated environment with CHA's DaVinci Xi surgical robot, Stryker Mako robot and other surgical devices used in the operating room. Students met with surgical professionals, including representatives from Intuitive Surgical, Stryker and Medtronic, to learn various techniques and discover career options in the field.

CHA has hired 12 Somerville youth and young adults as Career Pathways Fellows who gain early career exposure, career readiness and workforce development skills, with mentorship as well as weekly professional development programming. All CPP Fellows have worksite placements across CHA in areas including pharmacy, radiology, in patient psychiatry, dentistry, and more. Through this program Fellows will earn certifications including Teen Mental Health First Aid, CPR, and other useful skills to advance their healthcare career knowledge and skills for employment.

"Opportunities like the Cambridge OR visit are among the rich experiences the CPP Fellows are accessing during their time at CHA that expand their career aspirations and where they can see themselves in the future," said Jaime Lederer, CHA's director of community health youth initiatives. "CHA is committed to expanding healthcare career access for residents in the communities we serve."

Cambridge Health Alliance would like to thank the multiple surgeons, nurses, vendors and community health staff who volunteered their time to make this day and special program possible.

The CHA Career Pathways Program received support from an American Rescue Plan Act grant from the City of Somerville and the Cummings Foundation.





Somerville's annual Water System Flushing Program begins Thursday, May 16, and continues through late October.












JOIN THE SPRING HILL SEWER SEPARATION VIRTUAL SPRING HILL COMMUNITY MEETING ON MAY 15



Get the Spring/Summer Construction Schedule and Updates on Ongoing Streetscape Improvements and Spring Tree Plantings

SOMERVILLE - The Spring Hill Sewer Separation project is well underway, and Mayor Katjana Ballantyne and Ward 3 Councilor Ben Ewen-Campen invite you to join a virtual community meeting to learn about construction progress and upgrades to come. The project aims to reduce water pollution, address flooding, and modernize Somerville's infrastructure. Once utility work on Highland Avenue (including Eversource's Gas Main upgrade project) is done, interim paving of eastern Highland Avenue can begin.

The meeting will take place Wednesday, May 15, at 6 p.m. Visit somervillema.gov/springhill to learn more and attend the meeting. For those unable to attend, a recording of the presentation will be available on the project website, as well as on City YouTube and the City's GovTV channels.

At the meeting, City staff will review progress made to date and present an overview of the work planned

for this upcoming spring and summer. Featured updates include a review of recent sewer/drainage utility upgrades along Summer Street between School Street and Bow Street and a look ahead to streetscape improvements beginning later this spring on Central Street. Following the presentation, residents will have the opportunity to ask questions about the project and construction process.

Somerville's Spring Hill neighborhood is currently served by a combined sewer system, which collects

both wastewater and stormwater runoff in the same pipes. Through the Sewer Separation project, the City is working to upgrade these systems by installing new storm drains that separate stormwater from the existing combined sewer.

In addition to the under-

ground utility improvements, this project will also install street safety improvements and green infrastructure throughout the neighborhood. Green infrastructure includes trees as well as drainage features designed to mimic natural processes such as irrigated planting areas, bioretention basins with select soils and plants that

catch and filter stormwa-ter.

This project is one in a series of actions the City is undertaking to reduce water pollution, address flooding, and modernize Somerville's infrastructure. Construction began in 2022 and is expected to continue through 2025.

Highland Avenue Interim Paving

Following completion of utility work on Highland Avenue, the City will be paving the two travel lanes of

the roadway (approximately 28-feet wide). This partial paving, which does not include the parking areas next to the curbs, is intended to restore the road surface travel areas. This is an interim measure to support safe travel for all users of the road until the full redesign and reconstruction of Highland Avenue. Paving is on schedule to occur in early summer of 2024. This interim paving is expected to extend from roughly Mc-Grath Highway to Benton Road.

my family and you my friends are a blessing to me.







John attended Somerville High School until he enlisted in the US Army






