





and Josephine (Power) Kirwan.


Kevin especially enjoyed vacationing by the water whenever the opportunity arose. He treasured spending quality time with his family and friends, creat-

Mayor Ballantyne and SPD Announce Upcoming Co-Response Pilot to Support Residents in Mental Health Crisis



Pilot to launch next spring will implement key recommendation from Somerville's Public Safety for All Task Force

SOMERVILLE – As a significant step in realizing the City's commitment to Public

Safety for All goals, Mayor Katjana Ballantyne and Police Chief Shumeane

Benford announce that the City is preparing to launch a Co-Response Pilot Program this spring. The initiative will pair Somerville Police Department officers with trained public health professionals who will respond together to calls involving residents experiencing mental health crises.

The new program will be the first of its kind in Somerville, designed to provide a proactive, effective, and health-centered response to real-time behavioral health crises. Advantages of co-response include additional de-escalation capacity protecting the safety of all on scene – both individuals and officers – as well as swift service referral support for residents in need of a range of resources.

"Too often, people in mental health crisis are left without the right kind of

support in their moment of greatest need," said Mayor Ballantyne. "This pilot recognizes that an effective public safety approach encompasses care, dignity, and connecting people to resources. By bringing police officers and public health professionals together, we can provide the kind of response that our community has called for and that our residents deserve."

Chief Benford added, "Police officers are not always the best first responders for mental health emergencies, and they know that too. Working side-by-side with public health professionals will make our response more effective and safer."

The pilot builds on recommendations from the City's Public Safety for All process, a multi-year ini-

tiative led by the Department of Racial and Social Justice (RSJ) to reimagine public safety in Somerville.

Through surveys, listening sessions, and task force reports, residents voiced strong support for non-police or combined responses to incidents and emergency calls involving potential behavioral health crises. A clear majority said they want social workers/public health professionals involved in these calls, a finding that directly shaped the City's decision to move forward with this pilot.

To turn these recommendations into action, the City recently hired its first Public Safety for All Manager, a role dedicated to implementing the community-driven reforms outlined in the Public Safety for All reports. Advancing the co-response model is one of

the first major cross-departmental steps under this new leadership.

The initiative will also build on the City's long-standing Community Outreach Help & Recovery (COHR) jail diversion program, which embeds social workers and public health professionals within the Somerville Police Department to connect individuals with services and supports that help them avoid the criminal justice system. The new pilot represents a next step, moving from follow-up and outreach to direct co-response in real time.


Further details about the program's structure, staffing, and community partners will be announced in the coming months, with a launch expected in spring 2026.

SOMERVILLE—The City of Somerville is seeking polling place workers and standby poll workers for the upcoming Preliminary Election on Tuesday, September 16. Many poll workers are needed to support operations and conduct a successful election.

General Duties
Poll worker must be ready

to step in as needed on Election Day: Tuesday, September 16, 2025. The workday starts at 6:30 a.m. and ends after the polls close at 8 p.m., with a two-hour break. Poll workers would serve in the following role:

Inspectors – Check off names as voters check in, assist at the voting machine, or staff the demon-

CHANGE LANGUAGE IN LAW THAT CREATED COUNCILS ON AGING (H 4301)

The House gave initial approval to legislation that would change some language in the 50-year-old

law that created Councils on Aging in local cities and towns. Changes include deleting language that refers to “problems of the aging” and replacing

it with “the needs of older adults;” deleting language that calls workers “clerks” and replacing it with language that calls workers “staff;” and adding “and delivering services” to the language in the bill which gives the council the authority to “carry out programs.”

Supporters said the bill modernizes the language

in a 50-year-old law that created Councils on Aging at a time when there were very few senior centers. They noted that the number of Councils on Aging and senior centers has grown to 350 and said the bill updates the statute to reflect the modern functioning of these critical centers.

Rep. Kate Donaghue (D-Westborough), the

sponsor of the bill, did not respond to repeated requests from Beacon Hill Roll Call asking her to comment on passage of her proposal and whether she thinks it will make it through the Legislature in the 2025-2026 session. The bill was given initial approval by the House in the 2023-2024 session but died when the House took no further action on it.

PROHIBIT “JUNK FEES”

Attorney General Andrea Campbell announced that new regulations promulgated by her office earlier this year, which make junk fees and deceptive pricing illegal, took effect on September 2.

Campbell’s office explained that junk fees are hidden, surprise or unnecessary costs that increase the total price of a product

beyond the advertised price. Businesses often do not disclose such fees up-front or only share them at the end of a transaction after consumers have already provided their personal billing information. Similarly, some businesses have engaged in practices related to trial offers, subscriptions and automatic and recurring charges to conceal the total cost and nature of a product or service, while making it

difficult for consumers to cancel or opt-out of such features.

“Today, as we build upon the commonwealth’s nation-leading legacy of consumer protection, we make clear that ‘junk fees’ and deceptive pricing are not lawful,” said Campbell. “From concert tickets and hotel bookings, to subscription services and apartment rentals – surprise and unnecessary

charges have quietly cost consumers around the country tens of billions of dollars each year. Amidst rising costs, these historic regulations not only provide individuals with up-front transparency about the true cost of a good or service, but level the playing field for businesses by promoting trust and fair competition. I urge consumers and businesses to view my office’s resources to ensure compliance with

the new rules, which my office stands ready to enforce starting today.”





The House gave initial approval to a bill that would establish September 22nd as Military Service Members and Veterans

Suicide Awareness and Remembrance Day. The day would acknowledge that suicide is an epidemic among service members and veterans and works to foster awareness and

call for suicide prevention measures and support.

"We brought forward this veteran suicide remembrance and awareness bill in direct response to

the tragedies that have left holes in the fabric of our communities and in order to build awareness to prevent future tragedy," said bill sponsor Rep. Joan Meschino (D-Hull). "[The

bill] is an important step in offering support to both our active service members and veterans."

\$10.9 MILLION FOR DAMS, LEVEES AND COSTAL INFRASTRUCTURE

Gov. Maura Healey announced the awarding of nearly \$11 million in funding for dams, levees and coastal infrastructure.

Supporters said the funds will be used to repair or remove

aging dams, seawalls, levees and other critical infrastructure across the state. They noted it will support 23 municipalities and nonprofit organizations in making long-overdue repairs and taking down outdated structures that put homes, roads and neighborhoods at risk.

"Strong infrastructure keeps our communities running – from protecting homes during storms to keeping roads open and water secure," said Gov. Maura Healey. "By investing in these projects now, we're helping communities prevent future problems, save money

over time and keep people and neighborhoods safe."

"As a former mayor of a coastal city, I know how hard it is to find the funding to take on major infrastructure repairs, even when the need is obvious," said Lt. Gov. Kim Driscoll. "These grants help

cities and towns take on big repairs they couldn't tackle alone."

UNIFORM AGE FOR KINDERGARTEN (H 510)

Another proposal before the Education Committee would require that children be at least five years old by the beginning of the school year

in order to enter kindergarten that year. Under current law, the minimum age for kindergarten eligibility varies by district, as local school committees have the authority to set age requirements.

Supporters said this variation

has led to inconsistencies across the state regarding when children may begin their formal education.

“Back in 2012, a few teachers approached me with the idea for this legislation,” said sponsor Rep. Brian Ashe

(D-Longmeadow). “They emphasized the educational value of starting children’s learning as early as possible. I filed the bill based on its merits and the well-established fact that children who attend kindergarten build a stronger foundation for

future learning.”



MOTOR VEHICLE BATTERIES (H 2652)

The House gave initial approval to legislation that would require that motor vehicle repair and storage

facilities display a notice that informs the public and first responders of the presence of motor vehicle batteries on the premises.

"This legislation will put safety first in the event of a fire on a property where lithium-ion batteries are present," said sponsor Rep. Mike Kushmerek

(D-Fitchburg). "These batteries are notoriously dangerous and difficult to extinguish. By having identifying signs on location where the batteries

are present, it allows for more situational awareness for first responders who may be responding."

Somerville to Host Public Forums on State's Draft Cannabis Social Consumption Licenses



Mayor Ballantyne & Economic Development Office Invite Businesses & Community Members to Discuss City's Approach to Coming New Regulations

SOMERVILLE— The Massachusetts Cannabis Control Commission (CCC) recently drafted three types of licenses

allowing for the "social consumption" of cannabis by adults 21 and older in

approved venues, similar to those allowing for alcohol consumption. Once these regulations are finalized, communities will be able to choose whether they opt into the new rules.

In the coming months, the City will be reviewing the CCC's regulations and is proactively seeking public feedback to help shape Somerville's approach to cannabis social consumption. These licenses will create new opportunities for individuals and businesses to consume or serve cannabis in accordance with CCC regulations and guidelines. To inform Somerville's approach, Mayor Katjana Ballantyne and the City's Economic Development division invite local businesses and residents to

participate in upcoming forums to learn about and discuss options.

POSSIBLE NOVEMBER 2026 BALLOT QUESTIONS ARE CERTIFIED

Attorney General Andrea Campbell announced that her office has certified 40 possible ballot questions that could appear on the November 2026 ballot. Campbell had until September 3 to certify the questions as eligible or reject them as ineligible. Three possible ballot questions did not pass muster and were not certified because they do not meet the requirements outlined in Article 48 of the Massachusetts Constitution.

The next goal that the initiative's proponents must meet is the gathering and filing with the Secretary of the State the signatures of 74,574 registered voters by December 3. The proposal would then be sent to the Legislature and if not approved by May 6, 2026, proponents must gather another 12,429

signatures by July 1, 2026, in order for the question to appear on the November 2026 ballot.

Proposed laws that were certified include requiring voters to show identification at their polling places in order to be allowed to vote; overhauling or eliminating the financial stipends that legislative leaders award to many lawmakers for serving in the leadership and as committee chairs; subject the governor's office and Legislature to the state's public records law; allowing prospective voters to register and cast a ballot in a single trip to the polls on Election Day; enable Committee for Public Counsel Services staff — which includes public defenders, social workers, investigators and administrative staff who support indigent clients — to unionize; imposing rent control by curtailing rent

increases to the cost of living with a 5 percent increase, with some exemptions; reducing the personal income tax rate from 5 percent to 4 percent over a three-year period; using a portion of the funds generated from the existing sales tax on sporting goods to fund conservation; providing indigent tenants with an attorney in eviction and foreclosure proceedings; and allowing single-family homes on small lots in areas with adequate infrastructure.

"I applaud the civic engagement of our residents, who

filed a record-breaking [number of] ballot initiative petitions this year," said Campbell. "My office reviews each petition according to the strict criteria outlined in Article 48 of our State Constitution. Our personal opinions and any constitutional considerations outside of Article 48 cannot weigh into our decision-making about certification of a petition."

Campbell's office said that certification of a proposed ballot question does not represent the attorney general's support or opposition to the policies proposed. The Massachusetts Constitution requires that proposed initiatives be in the proper form for submission to voters, not be substantially the same as any measure qualified to appear on the ballot in either of the two preceding statewide elec-

tions, contain only subjects that are related to each other or mutually dependent and not involve a set of issues that are specifically excluded from the ballot initiative process by the Massachusetts Constitution.

The office offered examples of ineligible proposals including any proposal that relates to religion, religious practices or religious institutions; the powers, creation or abolition of the courts; the appointment, compensation or tenure of judges; a specific appropriation of funds from the state treasury; or infringement on certain other constitutional rights listed in Article 48, such as trial by jury, freedom of the press, freedom of speech and free elections.

Applications to vote by mail must be received by 5 p.m. (not postmarked) by Tuesday, September 9

Download an application or fill it out online at somervillema.gov/votebymail, pick one up in the Elections office at City Hall, or request one be mailed to you by calling Elections at 617-625-6600 ext. 4200. Ballots must be received by 8 p.m., Tuesday, September 16.

Eligible voters who submit valid applications will receive their

ballot in the mail. Ballots must be completed, signed, sealed, and received by the City no later than 8 p.m. on Tuesday, September 16. Voters can check the status of their ballot on the state's website.
